Schools Direct (salaried) recruitment is for positions starting in September 2013 and trainees may have the opportunity to engage with a fast track classroom practice course in term 2.

What are the criteria for training?

Applicants must hold a degree at 2.2 level or above.

Have 3 years post degree work experience in any field or hold GCSE (or equivalent) in Math and English – Primary applicants should also hold GCSE English.

All training posts will also be subject to the successful completion of National Teacher Skills tests (we recommend that applicants complete these tests prior to interview to confirm their place on the training programme) and a full CRB check (The alliance is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment).

What subject areas being sought?

Primary training – All subjects held within the National Curriculum are suitable.

Secondary subjects – English, Geography, Mathematics, PE, Chemistry and Physics.

What are the criteria for training?

Applicants should hold GCSE (or equivalent) in Maths and English – Primary applicants should also hold Science GCSE.

Training positions will be subject to successful completion of a Degree at a 2.2 level or above. With bursary levels being higher for those with 2.1 / 1st, Masters or Phd.
