

## Dance



#### What was the First Dance in History?

Early history of dance comes from 9000 year old cave paintings in India. One of the earliest uses of structured dance was introduced in religious ceremonies that told the stories of ancient myths and gods. Ancient Egyptians used dancing for both entertainment and religion . There are so many styles of dance out there from Breakdance to Ballet, Tap to Tango, Contemporary to Cha Cha.

#### Street Dance

Street dance has become really popular as a dance style through groups such as Diversity and Urban Strides. Street dance includes a large number of dance styles such as: breakdancing, popping, locking, house dance. Dance crews regularly appear on Britain's Got Talent and students from Highsted appeared on BGT as part of IMD Dance Company and made it to the semi finals in 2022.



#### **Ballroom Dancing**

Ballroom dancing is starting to increase in popularity because of TV shows like Strictly Come Dancing. The Italian Viennese Waltz, was the first ballroom dance that was ever created made popular by the famous composer

Johann Strauss. The Waltz was performed with arm's length between male and female dancers. The close embrace happened only after English Queen Victoria fell in love with the dance and forced this change.

# Biology: Carnivorous



Carnivorous plants are known for their fantastic colours and range of shapes which they use to attract, capture and digest their prey. They grow slowly as their energy is used to produce all of the features they need to capture and digest their prey. Pitcher plants use nectar to attract insects and other prey. As the prey approaches the plant it slips and falls into the pitcher. At the bottom of the tube, a sticky liquid containing digestive enzymes, breaks down the prey and releases the nutrients for the plant. This means



carnivorous plants can live in nutrient poor soil. They are often found in habitats near reptiles and amphibians. It is documented that they will capture frogs and salamanders, to consume the nutrients from them. Whilst carnivorous plants are known for their colours and shapes, new scientific research reveals that these plants use scent to lure insects to



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their traps. The scents produced by the plants target particular groups of prey. Scents produced by the plant may not be detectable to the human nose, but are far more clearer to the antennae of insects. The scent is similar to normal plants that are pollinated by many different species, therefore a wide range of potential prey including bees and butterflies are available to carnivorous plants.

Venus Fly Trap - Resist the temptation to touch!

However, tempting it is to tap the pad of a Venous Fly Trap to get it to close – resist the temptation!! Each trap has the ability to only shut around 5 times in its life time. Triggering it to shut, when it does not contain food may lead to early death.

The Venus Fly Trap has small hairs on the pads which are sensitive to touch. When an insect touches two of the hairs it causes the pad to shut with the insect trapped inside! Nutrients are then drained from the organism. These nutrients are essential for the Fly Traps survival as it lives in nutrient poor soil.

# **Surrealism**

#### <u>Surrealism</u>

Surrealism originated in the late 1910s and early 20s as a literary movement that experimented with a new mode of expression called automatic writing, or automatism, which sought to release the imagination of the subconscious. Surrealism officially began in

Paris 1924 with the publication of the Manifesto of Surrealism by poet André Breton. From this Surrealism developed in not only an artistic movement but a political one as well.

Many artists were involved in this movement including Salvador Dali, Max Ernst and Man Ray. One Persistence of Memory Salvador Dali



of the most prominent artists was a French man called André Masson whose drawings after and of 1924 depict curving, continuous lines which expressed strange figures that Masson believed expressed our creative minds.



The Surrealist movement came to an end at the beginning of WW2 but many modern artists still use these techniques to this day.




## "A tale of adventure and make-believe"





# Spicy Tomato Soup

## Spicy Tomato Soup

## **Ingredients:**

- 1 onion
- 1 carrot
- 1 potato
- 1 x can chopped tomatoes (400g)
- 500ml water
- 1 stock cube
- 1/2 x 5ml spoon dried chilli flakes
  - 1 x 15ml spoon tomato puree

## Method (Adult supervision required):

- 1. Prepare the vegetables:
- peel and slice the onion;
- top and tail, peel and slice the carrot;
- peel and cut the potato into 8.




Try pairing this amazing soup with some bread or croutons!!

2. Put all the ingredients into a saucepan.

3. Stir everything together, bring to the boil and then simmer for 20 minutes.

4. Ladle the mixture into the liquidiser and blend until smooth.







# Food Technology Mini Fruit Cake

## Mini Fruit Cake

## **Ingredients:**

100g self raising flour
100g caster sugar
100g butter or soft baking spread
2 eggs
50g dried fruit, e.g. sultanas
100g self raising flour
100g caster sugar
100g butter or soft baking spread
2 eggs



## Method (Adult supervision required):

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220°C or gas mark 6.
- 2. Place the cake cases in the patty tin.
- 3. Sift the flour into the mixing bowl and then add all the other ingredients.
- 4. Mix everything together until light and fluffy.
- 5. Stir in the dried fruit.
- 6. Divide the mixture equally between the cake cases using 2 spoons.
- 7. Bake for 15-20 minutes, until golden.
- 8. Allow to cool on a cooling rack.

# **Cheesy Scones**

## **Cheesy Scones**

#### **Ingredients:**

250g self raising flour

1 x 5ml spoon mustard powder

40g butter or baking fat/block

75g hard cheese

125ml semi-skimmed milk

## Method (Adult supervision required):

- 1. Preheat oven to 220°C or gas mark 7.
- 2. Grease or line the baking tray.
- 3. Sift the flour and mustard into the bowl.
- 4. Rub the fat into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs.
- 5. Grate the cheese.
- 6. Stir in the cheese.
- 7. Make a well in the middle of the flour and carefully pour in the milk. (Save just a little of the milk).
- 8. Mix to form a soft dough.
- 9. Place the dough on a lightly floured work surface.
- 10. Roll out the dough to about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cm thick.
- 11. Shape the scones using a cutter.
- 12. Place the scones on a baking tray and brush each top with a little milk.
- 13. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until golden brown.
- 14. Allow to cool on a cooling rack.
