 Life in Britain: Look at the census data from 2001 and 2011. In addition to changes in religious belief, what other changes have taken place over this time in Britain?	 Life in Britain: Think about the way in which your life is influenced by other countries and cultures. You could look at relatives, friends, food, music, things that you have in the home. Create a poster that summarises your findings.	 Life in Britain: Listen to Benjamin Zephaniah's poem 'The British.' Follow Link 1 (below)
 Christianity: Draw a 'family tree' diagram that shows the development of the different Christian denominations in this country	 Christianity: Watch the film 'Bruce Almighty'. What key Christian beliefs and concepts can you identify?	 Christianity: Dan Barker was a Christian minister but is now an atheist. Listen to his story – how strong do you think his arguments are? Follow Link 2 (below)
 Christianity: One of the arguments for Britain still being classed as Christian is the number of Christian places of worship that can be seen. How many are there in the local area? Which denominations do they belong to?	 Christianity: Visit Canterbury Cathedral or take the virtual tour. Write a postcard that describes your experiences. Follow Link 3 (below)	 Christianity: A key Christian belief is that you should help those in need. Choose a Christian charity (local or international) and design a poster that encourages people to support the organisation.
 Sikhism: Compare Sikhism with another religion of your choice. What beliefs do they have in common? In what ways are they different? Show your findings in a Venn diagram.	 Sikhism: What are the main Sikh festivals? Choose one and write a letter to a friend describing your experience of this from the point of view of a non-Sikh.	 Sikhism: Take a virtual tour of a Gurdwara. Follow Link 4 (below)
